Sue Reynolds Valor Scholarship Program

The 2024 Valor Scholarship ceremony took place on June 8th in Poway with more than 80 attendees. CHW awarded 50 residents with \$1,000 toward their education and/or vocational training. Study Stars Afterschool Program

42 student participants

In collaboration with robotics team "Green.Griffins; 10092," over 42 students aged 5-12 at Mayberry, Keeler Court, and Paradise Creek participated in a two-hour robotics workshop over the summer. This workshop aimed to

teach STEAM and robotics through fun, engaging, hands-on activities, helping youth develop problem-solving, critical thinking, and collaboration skills.

Health & Wellness

Older Adults Program

Through our contracted resident service partner, ElderHelp, the Mission Cove Seniors community has held weekly ZUMBA classes with an average of 5-7 residents joining each week. This has motivated the residents to voluntarily create a walking group, and UCSD has now engaged with them for a Fitbit study.





Resident Leadership Academy

In the past quarter, two of our Resident Leadership Academy (RLA) communities focused on community improvement safety projects that involved community forums. At Paseo Artist Village, RLA resident leaders attended a City Council meeting (27 residents participated) to appeal an earlier City Council decision that impacted the safety of residents and the surrounding community. Through these efforts, both propositions were approved on speed humps and traffic signal changes. This was a success for the Paseo Artist Village RLA Community Improvement Project, "Walkable Communities!"

Financial Well-Being

Savings Club

Six communities participated in CHW's Savings Club with our Financial Well-Being team and 37 residents completed the sixmonth program in Q2. Participants in the club saved an average of \$1,370.
